

Auburn Correctional Facility Health Care Facility Auburn, New York

Total Construction Cost: \$341,500.00

The existing 14,000 s.f. infirmary constructed in 1985 does not meet today's medical standards. The project comprises renovation of the existing building and a new 14,000 s.f. addition. A primary care clinic unit for more urgent care and inmate holding area for the facility are housed on the first floor with an infirmary unit for longer term care on the second floor. Primary care clinic handles emergency treatment, routine medical treatment, dental care, and X-ray. A regional pharmacy serves this facility as well as other facilities in the area. Four bed infirmary rooms and single bed isolation rooms compose the infirmary unit. The isolation rooms, with individual ante rooms, combine security needs with medical needs which are critical in the treatment of contagious diseases. The addition uses the same brick and style in order to blend with the existing structure. The addition, being taller than the existing building, can better handle the current codes, but requires a ramp to the second floor of the addition on account of the height. While this facility is in an urban setting, a 30' high boundary wall separates the complex from any contextual relationship to the city of Auburn.

Special areas for plumbing and fire protection design include isolation rooms, exam room, dental care and infirmary. All areas are designed for handicap accessibility according to ADA requirements. Special areas are designed with special featured high security fixtures conforming with ADA.

Dental care area includes vacuum piping systems and compressed air system.

X-ray area includes fixtures for x-ray developing.

Fire protection design is a wet pipe system for various occupancies.



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
